

Some key highlights from the raft of outputs delivered by the 17 recipients of CSF1 funding

Gêm – Media Academy Cymru

The Gêm Project enabled 30 students to study at least one Game Design pathway at MAC from February 2023 – June 2024. Using BTEC courses as a foundation, three new programmes of study were devised specifically for 16-25 year olds in Game Design and Development at Levels 1, 2 and 3.

Students were able to meet industry professionals, share their work, learn about potential career pathways in Wales with some invited to test play new games before they were launched for the public.

91% of learners said they felt equipped to meet the needs of the games industry from their experiences on their course. 80% of students progressed to further education courses in South Wales and 10 students progressed to higher courses in Game Design.

In addition, three of the Level 3 students have gone to university to pursue game related courses, one has deferred their entry to gain further work experience and two have gone into employment since leaving MAC.

Hollow Pixel Academy - United Filmdom Ltd

Hollow Pixel utilised the Level 4 Interactive Media apprenticeship pathway to deliver bespoke training in Blender 3D. All six apprentices utilised their new skills to deliver a joint <u>animation project</u> with all participants completing the "Welsh in the Workplace" with Dysgu Cymru. One apprentice took a GCSE in Welsh as a direct result of the course.

Hollow Pixel also won a Welsh Champion Apprenticeship Employer Award for this project.

Four of the six apprentices are now either freelancing or in permanent positions with major indigenous and global animation companies.

Refocus – Hijinx

The ReFocus project provided communications training for the screen industries designed to help anyone working in the screen sector, in any department, make their working practice more inclusive of learning disabled and/or autistic people. The one-day course is certified by the CPD Certification Service.

The Music Manager Development Fund – Music Managers Forum (MMF)

MMF delivered five training sessions as part of this project and developed two new resources in the Welsh language; Mental Health Guide and MMF Deals Guide.

Beacons Cymru – Beacons

Beacons Cymru delivered five programmes for young people aspiring to work in the music industry across Wales: Resonant, Summit, Future Disrupter, TransForm Music, and Bwts reaching almost 6,000 individuals.

Key Outputs

Music Futures / Professional Pathways – National Youth Arts Wales (NYAW)

The training NYAW delivered for young people across Wales culminated in recording sessions at the Rockfield Studios in Monmouthshire and a live performance experience at Corn Exchange Newport, where participants performed their music in front of a live audience. Selected participants were also invited to perform their work at Focus Wales, Wrexham in May 2024.

"I loved the experience from the start to the end, with all the help with the mentors and the people I was surrounded with. NYAW was incredible with helping us with new ideas and talks we had at Rockfield, and I hope in the future people who do decide to be a part of this have a similar experience, because it's an opportunity you can't miss!"

Games Developer Foundry Wales – Iungo Solutions

The Games Developer Foundry Wales (GDFW) delivered four new Level 4 and 5 training courses to 54 individuals from underrepresented backgrounds. The GDFW was delivered in three phases and covered modules in Programming for Games Development, Games Design, and Entrepreneurship.

Skills Sessions for Grassroots Music Venues – Music Venue Trust (MVT)

MVT delivered four in person training sessions for grassroots music venues across four regions in Wales; Cardiff, Swansea, Aberystwyth and Wrexham.

Creative Digital Sustainability, People, Pathways, Prospects – M-Sparc

Net Zero Pathway

In North Wales, M-Sparc delivered the Net Zero pathway, an accredited carbon literacy course for companies within the Creative-Digital sector designed to increase awareness and understanding of carbon emissions, climate change, and their associated impacts.

MSParc's Skills Academy strand provided 10 recent graduates with paid placements in screen, digital content and music businesses in Conwy, Gwynedd and Anglesey. Following their placements, five participants went straight into employment within the sector, two continued as freelancers, one progressed to a Degree Apprenticeship with their host company and two went to University to further their skills in animation.

Business and Leadership Pilot Programme – NFTS Cymru

NFTS Cymru provided bespoke training for leaders, managers and producers working in the TV and film industry in Wales.

Key Outputs

Developing HODs in Wales programme – ScreenSkills

The ScreenSkills, Developing HODs in Wales scheme supported up-and-coming HODs to shadow and work alongside existing HODs on HETV productions enabling them to gain experience, as well as get the all-important HETV credit for their CV.

Participant Peter Darney has since gone on to direct a short film that was shown on the opening night of the Iris Prize Fim Festival and was nominated for an award for best feature film for 'G Flat'. Peter praised the scheme and said that what he had learned from his placement on Lost Boys and Fairies had helped him to develop as a director.

Empowering Creative Freelancers – Bectu/Cult Cymru

This project saw a series of Mental Health resources developed and published, including two comprehensive <u>Mental Health</u> <u>and Wellbeing toolkits</u> – one for creatives, and one for creative team leaders.

rad Cymru Wales – TRC

rad Cymru Wales provided eight month long paid placements within a Welsh independent television production company for six individuals from underrepresented backgrounds. Placements were hosted by;

Training for the Future delivered – Sgil Cymru

Training for the Future provided opportunities for 130 individuals looking to either enter or progress within the screen sector. This included 44 upskilling opportunities.

The Creative Skills Fund (CSF) aims to nurture new and existing talent by training and upskilling individuals across the screen, music, immersive tech, animation and games sectors.
